

**Prof. Avv. Lorenzo Schiano di Pepe, LL.M. D.R.**



Lorenzo Schiano di Pepe is a full professor of law at the University of Genoa, Italy, where he currently teaches “EU Law” and “International and European Law of the Sea”.

He is the scientific co-ordinator of a summer school on “European Union and the Law of the Sea” (<http://eu-los.eu>) and teaches “Legal Aspects of Hydrography” at a master’s course programme in “Marine Geomatics”.

He is a visiting lecturer at the World Maritime University of Malmö, Sweden.

He holds a law degree from the University of Genoa (1997), master’s degrees from the University of London (UCL) (1999) and Georgetown University Law Center (2000) and a PhD in international law from the University of Milan (2004).

He attended the Georgetown University Law Center as a Fulbright scholar in academic year 1999/2000.

He has authored or co-authored several monographs, book chapters, essays, articles, encyclopaedic entries and case notes in areas such as public international law, private international law, international and European environmental law, international and European transport law, European institutional law and law of the sea.

He is a member of the Advisory Board on the Law of the Sea (ABLOS) upon appointment of the International Hydrographic Organization (IHO) and has been a member of the Italian delegation to UNCITRAL’s Working Group VI on “Judicial Sale of Ships” leading to the adoption of the United Nations Convention on the International Effects of Judicial Sales of Ships.

He has been a member of the board of the Italian Flight Safety Agency (ANSV) by appointment of the Italian Prime Minister H.E. Paolo Gentiloni in the period 2018-2022.

He is the co-editor in chief of the leading Italian environmental law journal “Rivista giuridica dell’ambiente”. He sits on the scientific board various scientific publications, including “Il diritto marittimo”, and on the editorial board of “Diritto del commercio internazionale”.

He has been a member of the governing board of the Italian Maritime Law Association (AIDIM) and is currently a member of the governing board of the Italian Association of European Law Scholars (AISDUE).

He is the co-ordinator of the interest group on law of the sea of the Italian Society of International Law (SIDI).

He is a member of the international working group of the Comité Maritime International (CMI) on “offshore activities”.

He is a member of the scientific committee of the Institute for the Law of the Sea and International Marine Environmental Law (ISRIM), based in Bremen, Germany.

He is a founder and partner of the law practice “SCD Avvocati & Partners” based in Genoa and Milan.

He regularly advises private entities, States and International Organizations on issues relating, among others, to the law of the sea and international and European environmental law.
